

Sergio DUARTE

Sergio Duarte is the United Nations' High Representative for Disarmament Affairs. Before his United Nations posting, Ambassador Duarte was elected as President of the Review Conference of the Parties to the Treaty Prohibiting the Emplacement of Nuclear Weapons on the Seabed and the Subsoil Thereof (Geneva). He also served as Chairman of the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA). In 2005 he was elected President of the VII Review Conference of the Parties to the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, in New York. He has represented Brazil at many other international meetings in the field of disarmament, arms control and non-proliferation. A career diplomat, Ambassador Duarte graduated in law from the Federal Fluminense University (Niterói, Rio de Janeiro) and in public administration from the Brazilian School of Public Administration (Getúlio Vargas Foundation, Rio de Janeiro).
